Operation Red Nose Will Not Operate Its Safe Ride Service in Saskatchewan for the 2020 Holiday Season

An awareness campaign, adapted to the health situation, will be revealed in November

Quebec City, October 7th, 2020 – After careful consideration of the current public health situation and its logistical impact on the service, Operation Red Nose has decided not to provide its famous safe ride service during the 2020 holiday season. Nonetheless, Operation Red Nose plans to pursue its mission of promoting responsible consumption while adapting to the current exceptional situation.

“The safety of our volunteers, clients, and local host organizations has always been one of our top priorities,” said Jean-Philippe Giroux, Executive Director for Operation Red Nose. “The decision was made after long and careful consideration, and not without emotion. We want to thank all of our volunteers and local partners who keep supporting their community year after year. We look forward to working with you again next year.” In November, Operation Red Nose will reveal the details of its 2020 awareness campaign, which will exclude the safe ride service this year.

Even in the absence of the safe ride service this year, Operation Red Nose will continue to promote its road safety message, and remind everyone to always plan for a safe way to get home by calling a friend, a relative, a cab, by designating a sober driver, or by staying overnight.
